

Jill Van Lokeren, Distinguished Alumni 2015, Visits Wyoming High School

Jill Van Lokeren graduated from Wyoming High School in 1986, and attended the University of New Hampshire. She worked her way through internships in New Hampshire and at the Sally Jesse Raphael Show in New York City, making sure to go above and beyond in every effort to make her mark.

ranks, Van Lokeren transitioned from producing to supervising to writing scripts to become the executive vice president of Harpo Studios, and she is now on her way to California to become the creative executive vice president of the Oprah Winfrey Network.

In describing her journey through life, Van Lokeren strongly emphasized the idea of dreaming big for yourself. She urged students to gain as much experience as they could through internships, and to follow their passions and interests in life. “If you know what you want to do, get in the door and get noticed,” she says. Van Lokeren also reminded students to be kind and to treat others as you want to be treated.
