



Sole Support Safety Plan for Staff and Volunteers

Thank you for participating in the PRO Sole Support packet pickup – September 12 from 10 am to 2 pm at Ponderosa Elementary in Bend. The health and safety of our clients, staff, and volunteers is our primary concern. As such, this year's Sole Support activities will adhere to OHA and CDC guidelines to ensure the wellbeing of all of our participants. To put your mind at ease, we've implemented the following safety procedures for the walks this year:

1. All Sole Support staff, on-site sponsors, and volunteers, will be required to wear masks and latex gloves for your shift at the packet pick up events.
2. All volunteers will be wearing an orange PRO volunteer shirt provided for your use at event to make you easily identifiable for guests.
3. All onsite staff, partners, and volunteers will confirm they've had no symptoms of COVID within the last 14 days before event opens to participants (see below).
4. Six feet social distancing is required where physically possible. Some volunteers will be interacting with participants via their car windows and may occasionally be closer than six feet. For this reason, drivers will also be required to wear masks while interacting with our volunteers and staff.
5. Each Sole Support packet pickup site has a staff delegated safety officer accountable for ensuring adherence to protocol. Additional volunteers may be asked to support them.
6. Groups/teams will be asked to stagger their arrival by assigned time.
7. We ask that all walk participants remain in their vehicles for packet pickup events.
8. Multiple walk routes have been suggested as options to ensure social distancing, comfort, and a great time raising awareness and Parkinson's disease around the region.
9. We have assigned arrival times by teams/groups to additionally ensure distancing and safety.

Your willingness to follow these guidelines to keep our community (and yourselves) safe is greatly appreciated. We look forward to seeing you at packet pickups!

Fever/Fatigue/Dry Cough/Poor Appetite/Muscle pain/Shortness of breath/loss of smell or taste

1. If you have tested positive for COVID-19, you affirm medical clearance to return to normal activity.
2. This information will be kept on file for 60 days as recommended by the State of Oregon.

Attendees will be asked to stay in their vehicles at all times, also wearing a face covering.
